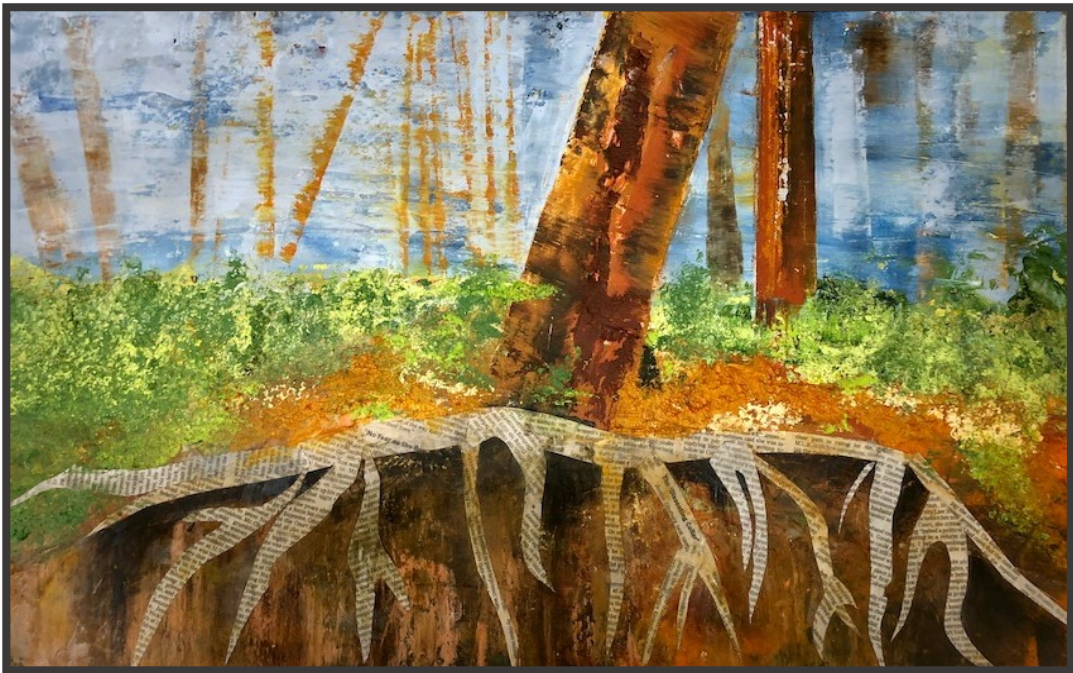
Ecological Psychology: An intra-related perspective

The problems that people, families, organizations, communities, and the world face today, from climate disasters, ecological ruptures, social justice conflicts, lack of access to education, rights to one's body and decisions about that body, physical and mental health, and economic fairness, to the despoliation of air, water, and soil, are not new. These interrelated problems stem from human narratives and their practices – from our psychology.

Overarching ecological principles and processes are studied psychologically because humans are ecological and function with the very same planetary processes (energy, diversity, decay &

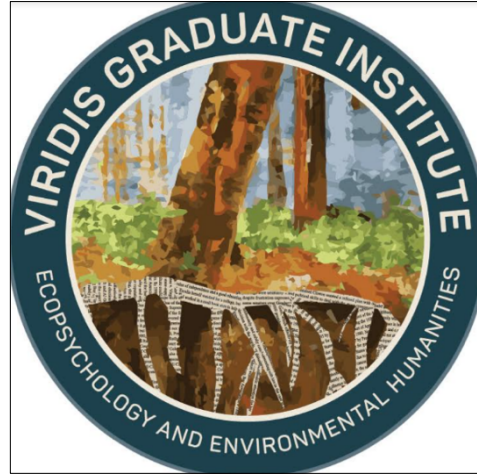
renewal, change, and relationality). Ecology offers an extraordinary understanding of one's psychology.

The study of ecological psychology necessarily takes us out of a confined "self or I" and into "we" that resituates us in a shared ecological world in a more relational manner.

During this zoominar we will examine:

- What co-shapes an ecological psyche – narrative and image – and what matters about this understanding?

Our focus will be in the first process of Energy Exchange. We'll examine a few ecological and psychological examples to get a better understanding of how narratives have an efficacy of their own: they can poison and enliven, destroy and innovate, close down and open up possibilities.



PRESENTER:

Lori Pye is the Founder and President of Viridis Graduate Institute.

Dr. Pye is a leading voice in developing the field of ecological psychology (ecopsychology) as pioneered at Viridis Graduate Institute. As an environmental activist and executive director for international marine non-profits, Dr. Pye worked with numerous NGOs to co-develop the Eastern Tropical Pacific Biological Seascape Corridor with the Ministers of the Environment from Costa Rica, Colombia, Panama, and Ecuador. Dr. Pye has multiple publications in peer-reviewed journals and serves on the Editorial Board for the *Ecopsychology Journal*. Her forthcoming textbook *Fundamentals of Ecological Psychology* is being published by Routledge.
