*It is ... wiser in practice not to regard dream-symbols ... as signs or symptoms of a fixed character, but as true symbols, i.e. as expressions of a content not yet consciously recognized or conceptually formulated. In addition, they must be considered in relation to the dreamer's immediate state of consciousness (C.G. Jung, CW16: 339).*

*In analysis we must never forget, even for a moment, that we move on treacherous ground where nothing is certain but uncertainty (C.G. Jung, CW16: 318).*

In representing a Jungian approach to working with dreams, ANZSJA analysts **Jacinta Frawley** (Sydney) and **Patrick Burnett** (Bangalow, NSW) will contextualize their approach to dreams and dreaming by exploring fundamental ideas of how Jungian analysts conceptualize the psyche. They will discuss the physiology of dreaming including contemporary advances in research in the biological sciences addressing dreams and the dreaming brain. They will present accounts of work with dreams and the role of dreams in clinical practice. The group will work on some dreams together.
