This seminar will explore the three Jungian Schools as classified by Andrew Samuels in his 1983 paper. Together we will reflect and explore the similarities and differences of being a post-Jungian Analyst with these three Schools: Classical, Archetypal and Developmental (Samuels, 1983).

We found it intriguing to consider two aspects of Samuels' clarification. Firstly, "all analytical psychologists are likely to use all these theories and are interested in all these clinical areas at some time and with some patients" (p. 353). And, secondly, it "can tell us as much about what is held in common as about the differences of opinion" (p. 354).

Our objective would be to contemplate the way in which our different ways of working might also reveal our shared foundation. We will apply and evaluate Samuel's grid of three clinical and three theoretical elements. Judith Hubback expressed that this grid contributes to "the professional self-analysis of the analyst" and that it was an "exploration of the analyst's professional inner world". (p. 356)
